



Bioenergy Association of California Bi-annual meeting and Lobby Day

Yosemite Clean Energy CEO Thomas Hobby attended the Bioenergy Association of California's bi-annual Sacramento meeting with over 60 bioenergy company leaders. The event provided several reports on various pending legislation matters affecting bioenergy, including SB1420, a bill of particular importance to Yosemite Clean Energy as it would implement a workable definition of "clean hydrogen" and introduce a mandated timeline for when retail hydrogen must be produced through renewable and clean means.

These definitions were a significant topic of discussion, and there was clear consensus that moving away from color wheels for H₂ is a positive step. Rather than relying on concepts like "blue" and "green" hydrogen, Carbon Intensity standards are the main drivers for meeting climate goals and achieving a zero-emission economy.

Hobby also attended the subsequent Lobby Day, and along with a group of BAC members met with 8 legislators, providing them with information on pressing bills like SB1420 and AB2514, while also drawing attention to the benefits of the biomass energy industry in general.
